Third NAIRS Summer School for PhD Students

Time: 25-28 September, 2018 Place: Centre for Baltic and East European Studies (CBEES), Alfred Nobels allé 7, Huddinge, Sweden

The purpose of the network is to foster European and national cooperation between academic institutions in all aspects of Romani studies. NAIRS coordinates practices and promotes multidisciplinary research on Roma, including studies of Roma culture, history, religion, politics and societal status, language, literature and folklore etc., and makes them available to a wider audience. Its overall objective is to develop Romani studies as a well-networked discipline and to cooperate with other academic fields.

As part of its main activities, NAIRS promotes and conducts joint research projects, PhD supervision, student, post doc and staff exchanges and scholarly visits, as well as teaching cooperation between its member institutions. Consequently, the call is open for applications for the **Third Summer School for PhD Students**, which will take place in Huddinge (Stockholm) on 25-28 September, 2018.

The objective of NAIRS summer schools is to create an interdisciplinary space for the networking of young scholars in Romani studies. An interdisciplinary team of lecturers will present their research and approaches to Romani studies and will share their experience and knowledge with Summer School participants. The Summer School presenters and lecturers will be announced by 31 August, 2018. The participants will present their on-going projects and participate in feedback and discussion sessions. The event will be thematically open for any topics related to Romani studies.

Participant contributions of highest quality will be given space for publication in the peer-reviewed journal Romani Studies (<https://online.liverpooluniversitypress.co.uk/loi/rost>), published by the Gypsy Lore Society.

There is no participation fee for the event and NAIRS will provide bursaries to cover travel and accommodation expenses for most participants. **General requirements for the participants**

- PhD student dealing with any aspect of Romani studies
- Preference is for the students of Member institutions of NAIRS, but we encourage all interested PhD students to apply

Interested participants are encouraged to submit 1) a CV, 2) a letter of interest, and 3) an abstract of on-going research project (max. 1 page) to Professor Kimmo Granqvist, Chairperson of NAIRS at kimmo.granqvist@sh.se.

The deadline for applications is 10 August, 2018. Successful applicants will be informed by 15 August, 2018.
